Evaluation of the CoP





Monitoring data –

- High interest in participating in the CoP:
 participants from 11 organisations higher than expected
- Continued participation at CoP meetings is good to date:
 average = 17 CoP participants
- Good attendance at optional training sessions to date:
 average = 14 CoP participants

Evaluation of the CoP





Primary Evaluation Question –

Has the SCAPP WP Evaluation Matters Community of Practice been successful in the aims of building evaluation knowledge and capacity in participants and the sector?

- Ethical approval from the University of Glasgow College of Social Sciences Ethics Committee
- Interim online survey circulated to CoP participants at the end of April and received 14 responses (61% response rate)
- Further surveys and interviews planned for later in the year


Online survey results, May 2023






Please rate your experience in the Community of Practice so far (1 to 5 stars):

Has the Community of Practice met your expectations so far?


